

Michael Stone is one of the leading international specialists in humanitarian and development response, with special reference to Refugees and IDPs. He has substantial experience of directing large scale operations with NGOs, International Red Cross and the United Nations. He has worked impartially for a number of years in the conflict areas of Afghanistan, Pakistan, former Yugoslavia, Georgia and Iraq.

In addition, he has chaired co-ordination bodies, evaluated programmes around the world at policy level for NGOs, the International Red Cross, the EU, UN and Governments, prepared policy papers for senior politicians, and given talks at international conferences on such topics as How to Encourage China to Cooperate, the Future of the Humanitarian System, the Dangers of Meaningless Language, and the Humanitarian Consequences of Climate Change.

He has worked closely with many inspiring people including Mother Teresa and Princess Diana (leading the anti-personnel mines campaign).

Michael Stone is currently on the Board of the Commonwealth Human Rights Initiative with special responsibility for human rights in the 22 Commonwealth countries of the Western Hemisphere. He is also on the board of the international NGO Evidence Aid, which bridges the academic and humanitarian worlds, and contributes to improved decision making in the context of large scale humanitarian programmes. .

His most recent completed project, for the EU, is to examine the Government of Ukraine's handling of its internally displaced with special reference to IHL and IHRL, and make appropriate recommendations in relation to future EU funding.
